Bahrain: A leader in charity work



Bahrain joined the world in marking the International Day of Charity, observed worldwide every September 5, amid its commitment to its noble historical, religious and humanitarian fundamentals that foster the values of giving, compassion and social solidarity, as well as its pride in its pioneering achievements in supporting charity work and preserving the rights and human dignity of all, under the wise humanitarian approach of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa.

The kingdom's celebration of this year's International Day of Charity coincides with the delivery of an urgent humanitarian relief aid to Afghanistan, based on the directives of HM the King, and the support of the government, led by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister. The shipment was delivered by the Royal Humanitarian Foundation (RHF), led by HM the King's Representative for Humanitarian Work and Youth Affairs, HH Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa.

The move is within the kingdom's constant keenness to extend assistance to brotherly and friendly countries, and provide relief aid to the afflicted, out of

its belief in the inherent human dignity of all human beings, and in recognition of the value of benevolence and giving in consolidating peace and promoting understanding and mutual respect among all peoples and civilisations.

Over the past years, the RHF has been able to implement more than 40 relief initiatives for those affected by wars, crises and natural disasters, including the provision of donations, grants, relief aid, medicine and food, launching development projects, and supporting relief efforts and evacuations from Afghanistan.

The kingdom has also stimulated international humanitarian action through the launch of the royal initiatives, such as the "Isa Award for Service to Humanity", and many awards that promote volunteerism and sustainable development.

This international dimension of Bahrain's humanitarian work reflects the culture of charitable and voluntary work of which the Bahraini society has always been known, and strengthened since the establishment of the RHF two decades ago. The RHF has sponsored more than 11,000 orphans and widows, cared for the elderly and people with

special needs, provided educational and health care assistance and supported the social and charitable projects.

Since the outbreak of the novel Coronavirus pandemic, the RHF has stepped up its humanitarian efforts by launching the "Feena Khair" national campaign, succeeding in collecting donations valued at \$100 million allocated to supporting micro-entrepreneurs and Bahraini families, providing computers for distance education, and distributing food baskets, medicines and medical masks.

During the pandemic, the government, represented by the Ministry of Labour and Social Development, continued its efforts in providing financial support programmes for low-income citizens, in an attempt to empower them economically. In this regard, the Labour Ministry's "Khatwa" programme for home projects won the Arab Government Excellence Award for the year 2020 as the Best Arab Government Project for Community Development, after its contribution over the past 10 years to the success of 954 families in obtaining licenses to work from

home, and 48 families in becoming entrepreneurs.

The kingdom's rich record of humanitarian work has been acclaimed locally and internationally, ranking the first in the Arab world and 12th globally in the World Giving Index 2021 issued by the London-based Charities Aid Foundation (CAF).

HM the King was also conferred the Global Leadership Award in the field of orphan care by the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation in 2017.

In 2020, HH Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad received the Honorary Leadership Personality of the Year Award in the donation field, granted by International Donor Service Centre.

The RHF won the "Best Charity Organisation Award", granted by the Foundation of Arab Achievers, in addition to the second edition of the "Prince Mohammad bin Fahd Award for Best Charity Performance in the Arab World" (2019-2020), organised in partnership with the Arab League's Arab Organisation for Administrative Development under the theme "Towards a Better Future for Institutional Charitable Work in Arab Nation".

education across the dimensions of natural sciences and engineering. “Since conducting laboratory experiments is one of the best ways to inspire, motivate and revitalize today’s youth, the College of Natural and Health Sciences at Zayed University, as part of its educational strategic plan, aims to provide experiential learning through practical projects that give students the needed ‘hands-on’ experience through learning by doing, which allows students to link theoretical sciences with applied sciences,” Dr Howari said.

The public can now interact with and access spectral information through the UAE’s first spectral library website.

The Hyperspectral Remote Sensing Centre at the College of Natural and Health Sciences at Zayed University has earned a commendable badge by presenting the website for public use.

The centre is considered the first

of its kind in the UAE to carry out planetary studies, environmental studies, training and consultancy in the remote sensing sector.

Professor Dr Fares Howari, dean of the College of Natural and Health Sciences, Zayed University, said that the centre is equipped with a Mars Simulation chamber, which creates the environment of any

planet to study and simulate these environments using hyperspectral imaging in the laboratory.

Established with the help of the Emirates Space Agency, the centre aims to face the challenges of the remote sensing sector in the UAE Space Agency and beyond. It will also provide opportunities for stratified research, innovation and

Saudi Arabia has become a tourist destination so the Kingdom’s tourism sector is launching extensive training programs in different cities throughout the country with awards up to SR45,000 (\$11,700).

The “Tourism Pioneers Camp” includes extensive workshops with meetings, guidance sessions, prototypes, and training on presenting innovative projects.

The program targets a number of activities related to the tourism sector including tourism accommodation, cultural, recreational, and sports activities. Saudi activities and products, travel and tourism agencies, food and beverages, leasing services, in addition to land, air, sea, and railways transport will also be included.

- Publish a booklet jointly with the Indian Embassy about general country information and doing business environment and legal structures in India and Bahrain .
- To actively pursue the achievement of Double Taxation Avoidance Agreement (DTAA) between Bahrain and India. In this regard the BIS Chairman handed over a letter addressed to Nirmala Sitharaman - Minister of Finance – India, giving justification for such an agreement.
- BIS' plan to hold a program next month to celebrate the commemoration of 50 years of diplomatic relationship between India and Bahrain as well as the 75th Independence Day of India. The focus during this event will be on culture and food.

The Board thanked the Ambassador for his support and encouragement to the BIS and assured him that the BIS will work closely with the Embassy to achieve all its objectives.

21,000 Tonnes of Plastic and Paper Waste Recycled in Bahrain in 2021 by 'Al Majid Recycling Factory'



Al Majid Recycling Factory (the "Factory"), the Kingdom's leading provider of recycling solutions, has announced that it has successfully processed and recycled around 21,800 tonnes of paper, plastic, and solid materials during the first eight months of 2021, at an average rate of 2,000 and 600 tonnes per month of paper and plastic, respectively.

Almajid Recycling Factory was established in 1985 and was the first operation to introduce paper processing and recycling in Bahrain and the second in the GCC. In 2012, the Factory expanded into end-to-

end plastic processing and recycling. The Factory currently recycles 14 types of paper and 7 types of plastic, including cardboard, printing paper, water bottles, industrial storage barrels, and styrofoam amongst others.

Mr. Hameed Al Majid, Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Al Majid Recycling Factory commented: "For the past 28 years, our Factory has played an integral role in protecting the environment of Bahrain by processing and recycling various types of waste that would otherwise end up in a landfill. The Factory

has forged strong partnerships with government entities, financial institutions, schools, and universities, to provide tailor-made recycling solutions, all in the aim of protecting the Kingdom's environment. The Factory is expected to process and recycle more than 30,000 tonnes of waste by the end of 2021. In addition to the environmental significance of our operations, 26 local enterprises depend on the Factory's recycled material as a substitute for expensive virgin raw material inputs, which in turn preserves valuable natural resources."

Mr. Al Majid added: "It is estimated that around 4 billion plastic bottles are consumed in the Kingdom annually, most of which are disposed in the Askar landfill. It takes around 450 years for a plastic bottle to fully decompose. During that time, a decomposing bottle gradually releases harmful toxic chemicals that pollutes the Kingdom's soil and groundwater, ultimately affecting people's health. Alongside plastic bottles, tonnes of industrial barrels are similarly disposed which further exacerbates environmental damage."

Mr. Almajid stressed: "In 2020, a record of more than 600,000 tonnes of municipal waste was disposed in the Askar landfill, with figures expected to increase even further in the coming years. The most successful recycling initiatives globally are based on integrated public-private partnerships, where the public sector is responsible for providing appropriate support in the form of subsidized funding or access to industrial land. In order to effectively address the Kingdom's recycling needs, the industry requires similar aid."



Resolving minor traffic accidents just got easier through the eTraffic app!



Traffic accidents are an unfortunate part of modern life. While we hope you never find yourself in one, should you ever have a minor traffic accident in Bahrain, that cause traffic jam and may take from accident makers time, there is now a new way to address the issue quickly and effectively.

The eTraffic App, which is available via bahrain.bh/apps allows you to report mutually resolved minor traffic accidents directly through insurance companies, without involving the

traffic directorate. Remember, if someone is injured, it is not a minor accident, and you must call the traffic police right away on 199 or the national emergency hotline on 999 to request an ambulance.

In the case of a minor accident, such as a 'fender bender' or a scrape, both parties must first agree about who is at fault. The affected driver may report the accident through the 'Report Traffic Accidents' feature on the eTraffic app, and the responsible driver must acknowledge it at their end through the 'Traffic Accident Acknowledgement' feature.

Alternatively, the responsible driver may report the incident through 'Report Traffic Accidents', which means he or she automatically acknowledges their fault. Both parties must then visit the insurance provider of the party who is at fault within 48 hours. Other helpful features are 'View Reported Traffic Accidents' and 'Insurance Companies Locator'.

In general, the eTraffic App is a great tool to have on your smartphone if you are a motorist

in Bahrain. It allows you to access various services from the General Directorate of Traffic, such as renewing your vehicle registration or driver's license, issuing international driver's licenses, paying traffic fines, and more. The app is available on iOS and Android.

Samsung releases eco-friendly watchbands made from apple peel



Samsung has announced six limited edition watch bands for the Galaxy Watch 4 made of recyclable and eco-friendly materials including apple peel. The range was made in collaboration with Sami Miró, a fashion designer whose previous collections have made use of

upcycled materials.

There are six designs included in the collection. The "Midnight Black" and "Stratus Sky" bands are made out of 100 percent apple peel skin "recovered from the fruit industry." Samsung claims the material has the "premium look of

leather" while obviously not being sourced from animals. The other four designs ("Aurora Night," "Cloud Navy," "Earth Sunrise," and "Dawn Atlas") are made of a thermoplastic polyurethane (TPU) material which Samsung says is recyclable.

Alongside the watch bands

Samsung is also releasing a collection of three complementary free watch faces available for download from the Google Play store.

Yes, the most sustainable choice will always be to use the watch band that came with your smartwatch, but if you're going to buy an aftermarket watchband it's nice to know some effort's been made to reduce its environmental footprint. Personally I hope that Samsung's future smartwatches might use these materials as standard, rather than only in optional accessories.

Samsung already uses sustainable materials in its packaging, and as of last year its sites across the US, China, and Europe were powered by 100 percent renewable energy (that's not the case for all regions, like Korea, but Samsung says it's working on it). But, it still has a lot of work to do to reduce the environmental impact of its devices themselves, particularly when it comes to repairability.
